

ACID POISONING CAN BE TREATED SUCCESSFULLY

College Station, Raleigh.-Cyanide prussic acid poisoning in cattle or sheep can be treated successfully if he necessary steps are taken in time, according to Dr. C. D. Grinnells, associate professor of animal husband-

The prescribed treatment, as developed in the veterinary research laboratories, is intravenous injections of sodium nitrate or sodium phate. Practicing veterinarians can administer it.

The symptoms of cyanide poisoning are an increased rate of breathing and a rapid heart beat, followed by prostration

Dr. Grinnells also urged farmers to watch their sheep closely for evilence of parasites. Parasites do no always produce symptoms which are visable to untrained observers, and therefore may do considerable damage before being discovered. Occasionally a number of sudden deaths in the flock may be traced to stom-

A close watch on those heifers which are to freshen this fall is also advisable, Dr. Grinnells pointed out. Milk production causes a heavy drain on their bodies, and they should be given good care and feed so they will continue to grow during the period of the first lactation.

Often the body reserves of heifers which have not been given the proper attention are sufficient only for milk as citizens by all the other States, and that the public acts of each State production and the animals do not attain their proper body development
