**Safeguarding Against ELECTRICAL HAZARDS**

**Appliances**

All appliances which a person can purchase are approved by the national board of fire underwriters. Therefore, you can be assured that the proper size wire to each appliance is correct.

The above mentioned should be a good guide as to the size and type wire to be used if extensions are necessary.

For example: The lead in wire to an electric iron is insulated with asbestos to withstand the heat generated by the current and temperature of the room in which the iron is being used. Therefore, you would not use an extension cord with a smaller wire and lower heat resistant insulation than is used by the iron. The current which the iron will draw would cause a smaller wire extension to overheat, and in many cases catch fire if not of fire proof insulation.

It has been found by the Fire Underwriters that 50% of all electrical fires are caused by the use of improper extensions cords. All extensions should be kept in good repair for your own protection.
