While the national argument goes on over a housing program, the building industry is enjoying the biggest boom singe the lush years of the 1920's. Number of new permanent housing units started increased from 671,000 in 1946 to 855,000 in 1947 and completions rose from 485,000 in 1947.

The kreatest advancement, however, was the average time for completing a house was cut from seven months in January 1947 to 4½ months in January 1948. Reason was that building materials are more plentiful, workers are more efficient but costs are still higher. Average construction costs of a one-family home rose from \$4,065 in 1940 to \$5,520 in 1946 to \$6,348 by the fall of 1947.


