#### Reservists Must Register For Draft

According to information re- Phone 179-W ceived from Capt. J. C. Davis-Commanding officer of the U.S. Army and U. S Air Force recruiting station in Lenoir, members of all the reserve components who are within the registration age, must register in acordance with the Selective Service Act of 1948. Capt. Davis, stated the reserve components include the National Guard, Enlisted Reserve Corps, and Organized Reserve Corps.

Neither the Act nor the Presidents proclamation make any provisions for exemptions from registration for members of reserve components who are otherwise eligible unless such reservists are now on active duty.

Those men who are now members of the reserve components and who served in the Armed Forces during World War II, and are within registration age must also register according to Capt. Davis's statement.

Those who were members of the National Guard or Organized units of the reserve components on effective date of the Act are exempt from service so long as they remain members, and satisfactorily participate in scheduled drills and training as prescribed by the Secretary of De-


