While there Mr. Shipley attended a dinner meeting with Governor-nominate Scott, Commissioner of Agriculture Coltrane, Fair manager Dorton and a large number of agricultural leaders of the state to discuss plans for enlarging the facilities of the State Fair. A building program will probably get underway this year which will include a large coliseum and a junior livestock building among the first buildings.

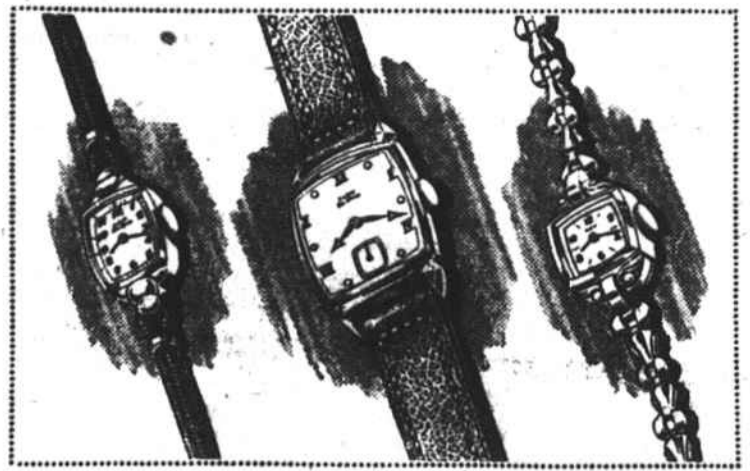
