G. C. Greene, Jr., said his Horn in the West committee favors the employment of one man to handle publicity and promotion for the Chamber, Horn in the West, Blowing Rock, Grandfather Mountain, and all other attractions in the area on a year-round basis, if such an arrangement can be worked out.

W. Guy Angell, chairman of the education committee, announced that Watauga County schools will make facilities available to new industry for vocational training of workers. He also recommended added police protection at the elementary school at noon and when school is dismissed in the afternoon.

Milton Jordan, speaking for the road committee in the absence of Chairman W. Ralph Winkler, reported that several road projects are under consideration, and Mr. Winkler is in Raleigh this week endeavoring to secure funds for these projects.

Stanley A. Harris, business manager of the Chamber, asked that all committees which do not meet and formulated plans do so before the February meeting and submit their reports at that time.

### Says Incomes On Farms Low

"The incomes of many farm families have been low for a long time," says C. E. Bishop, agricultural economist at North Carolina State College. Bishop believes that the basic cause for low incomes of North Carolina farm families is the low productivity per farm worker. This low productivity, he states, results from the fact that relatively little capital and land are used in agriculture per farm worker.

Bishop claims that if the productivity per worker is to be increased, the amount of capital and land per worker must be increased. He feels that in order to accomplish this increase in productivity, it will be necessary to produce more efficiently and to increase the size of the farm business.

If the size of the farm business is to be increased, points out Bishop, this will involve better use of the land and buying or renting additional land. This growth should be accompanied by mechanization, as mechanization increases the productivity of labor.

To mechanize and to expand farm size, an increase in the amount of capital per worker will also usually be needed, states Bishop. He points out that in particular, additional adjustment credit is needed for intermediate periods of three to five years.

Bishop claims that industrial development, off-farm employment and shifts of farm population to non-farm residences are making it possible to increase the land area in farms by buying additional land or renting land. Rental arrangements need to be modified in order to encourage mechanized op-

erations in agriculture and to encourage an expansion of farm commodities, especially livestock products, for which the demand appears to be relatively favorable during the next 20 years, he concludes.

### Five Children Store Robbers

North Wilkesboro, Jan. 7—Robbery of a store and McGrady Post Office Saturday night was solved Sunday by the arrest of five juveniles, some of them so small they would not have been able to carry away any substantial amount of loot.

Wilkes Deputy Sheriff Hoke Wiles tracked down and arrested five boys ranging from the tender age of eight to 14. The officer said the lads admitted entering Wint Osborne's Store, which also houses McGrady Post Office, 15 miles north of here on Highway 18. Mrs. Osborne is postmaster. Entrance to the store was through a front window.

The boys stocked up on candy bars, cigarettes, cakes and other goodies and took a small amount of change from the store and from the Post Office quarters. One boy's share of the loot was a dime, which he said he buried. A smaller one said he got only one penny.

Asked why they broke into the store and post office, the boys told Officer Wiles that they did not know why they did it.

Each of the lads was cited to appear at 10 a. m. Saturday, Jan. 12, before Miss Cora Caudill, clerk of Wilkes Superior Court.

Meanwhile, postal inspectors have been notified and a representative of the Post Office Department is expected here Tuesday to make investigation of the theft.
