STATEMENT OF RESULT OF SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE TOWN OF BLOWING ROCK ON JANUARY 22, 1937

WHEREAS, by direction of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Blowing Rock, in the State of North Carolina, a special election was duly called and held in said Town on January 22, 1937, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said Town the following proposition:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 Shall the qualified voters of the Town of Blowing Rock approve the bond ordinance which was adopted by the Board of Commissioners of said Town on September 29, 1936, and which (1) authorizes bonds of said Town of the maximum aggregate amount of \$40,000 to finance the cost of constructing a swimming pool, on land now owned by the Town, suitable to provide recreational facilities for the inhabitants of the Town, and (2) authorizes the levy and collection of an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of the interest on said bonds; and also approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of said bonds?

Said Board of Commissioners has duly canvassed the returns of the Registrar and Judges of Election appointed to hold said election and has determined the result of said election to be as hereinafter stated: NOW, THEREFORE,

Said Board of Commissioners hereby makes the following statement of the result of said special election, pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina:

(1) The number of voters registered and qualified to vote at said election was 478.

(2) The number of votes cast at said election for the ordinance described in Proposition No. 1 and for the indebtedness proposed to be incurred by the issuance of the bonds authorized by said ordinance was 154. The number of votes cast at said election against said ordinance and against said indebtedness was 41.

(3) A majority of the voters voting at said election voted to approve said bond ordinance and said indebtedness.
