in a tightly covered container. Soft cheese should be bought in the amounts to be used in a short time. Other cheese keep well in a cold place tightly wrapped so that air is kept from it. Wrap unpackaged cheese tightly in waxed paper, laminated foil, or similar wrappings. If mold forms, scrape off-it does not hurt the cheese. Should cheese dry and become hard, grate it and keep in covered container. It can be used in cas-
