Last year North Carolinians ste an average of 12.3 quarts of ice cream per person, a quart less than in 1935. Americans averaged than in 1955. Americans averaged 16 quarts per person in 1956. Al-though per capita consumption of incugal per capita consumption of ice cream dropped one quart during the past year in the state, an increase in ice milk consumption was noted with approximately 4.8 quarts consumed per Tar Heel.

Cottage cheese consumption in the past few years have been consumption in

Cottage cheese consumption in the past few years has shown a steady increase in consumption. The high protein or body main-taining analysis. taining qualities of cottage cheese plus its being easily digested and readily assimilated has proven popular in the past few years. During the last four years per capita consumption of cottage cheese in North Carolina has doubled from 2-3 of a pound to 1.49 pounds in 1956. Even with remendous increases in consumption North Carolina is still three pounds under the 4.4 pounds na-tional per capita average.

Although North Carolina is coniderably below the national average in per capita consumption of these basic dairy products steady progress has been noted within recent years. Since 1950 Tar Heel per capita milk consumption has increased from 100 quarts to the resent 134 quarts per person while the national average has renained approximately the same
