## Curb Market Opened By Demonstration Clubs

The Home Demonstration Curb Market which is located on 509 East King Street will open on Tuesday, June 18th at 8:00 a. m. and will close at 12:00 noon. Goods to be sold will be homemade cakes, cookies and pies, bread, garden fresh vegetables and fruits, fresh eggs, dressed chickens, cured ham, handicrafts and jams, jellies, preserves and other canned foods and cut flowers.

The market will be open each Tuesday, from 8:00 a. m. to 5 p. m. and Friday 8:00 a. m. to 5 p. m. each week during the summer.

Any person selling on the market must abide by the following rules and regulations which were set up by Watauga County Home Demonstration Club women and Extension Specialist in Food Conservation and Marketing of N. C. State College.

1. This market was organized by the Home Demonstration Club women for Watauga county but any citizen of Watauga or neighboring counties who abides by the rules and regulations, produce their own food and trade in Watauga county may sell on the market.  
2. Each producer must pay a fee of 5% for the privilege of selling.  
3. Each seller is required to wear a plain white cover all uniform and hair net.  
4. Members are not permitted to buy and resell.  
5. Members are not allowed to solicit business from customers.

Each seller will be required to have a health certificate.  
Sellers are to stand behind their products. Refund money if customer is not satisfied.  
The chairman should see that rules are obeyed.  
Any violation of the above rules forfeits the right of the producer to sell on the market.

The market committee will welcome any seller who abides by these rules and regulations.
