### FEDERAL PAYROLL

The Federal Government's civilian pay roll exceeded \$11,000,000,000 during the last fiscal year for the first time, according to Senator Harry F. Byrd, chairman, Joint Committee on Reduction of Non-essential Federal Expenditures. The total for the year ended June 30 was \$11,000,474,000. This compared with slightly over \$10,500,000,000 in the previous fiscal year and about \$9,500,000,000 each for the two preceding years. Average civilian employment during the 12 months also reached a new high of 2,394,099 persons—an increase of about 60,000 over the previous fiscal year.
