

College Debate Query Touches Union Issue

Appalachian State Teachers College has just received notice that the national intercollegiate debate query for 1957-58 will be "Resolved: That The Requirement of Membership in A Labor Organization As A Condition of Employment Should Be Declared Illegal."

The notice came to the North Carolina Epsilon Chapter of Pi Kappa Delta, on the campus of Appalachian. The query was sent by Dr. L. E. Norton of Bradley University, Peoria, Illinois, who is the national president of Pi Kappa Delta.

Dr. Norton is a member of the committee of various speech organizations which chooses the intercollegiate debate and discussion questions. Pi Kappa Delta is one of a number of forensic organizations which decide these questions, which were chosen following a compilation of the votes of debate coaches throughout the country who are members of these various forensic fraternities.

In addition to the debate query, Dr. Norton notified Appalachian that the national discussion question this year is: How Can Our Colleges And Universities Best Meet The Increasing Demand For Higher Education? This question will be used for panel-type discussion, which is one of the speech activities in intercollegiate meets.

Each year, early in December, Appalachian schedules a practice tournament on the campus. This gives an opportunity to North Carolina teams, and those from other states nearby, to qualify debaters and other speakers for intercollegiate meets.

Yule Trees To Be Sold

Asheville, Sept. 13—Christmas shopping will start early on Roan Mountain near Burnsville this year.

The North Carolina National Forests Office says 14,000 Christmas trees will be auctioned there Oct. 18.

Last year, 16,000 Roan Mountain trees were sold for 70 cents each. Timber-Management Specialist J. L. Shontz predicted the price will be higher this year.

The trees are Fraser balsam firs, considered by many to be

the most beautiful Christmas tree. They grow only in the east at elevations above 5,500 feet. The Roan Mountain growth is the heaviest concentration anywhere.

Ranger Don Flyman said only 20 per cent of the trees on a 70-acre section will be cut for Christmas trees. The growth covers about 1,000 acres. He said the cutting is beneficial to the forest.

Cutting of the trees will begin early in November and continue through the first or second week in December.

The balsams are used for wreaths as well as Christmas trees.

Flyman said the trees are stored in a cool, moist place until time to be placed on the market.
