### Dr. Jones, Mr. Cole To Appear In Flute Concert

A program of flute music will be presented by Dr. William Jones, flutist, and Walton S. Cole, accompanist, on Thursday, September 19, at 8 p. m., in the Fine Arts Auditorium at the college. The public is invited.

The program is drawn from flute literature of various periods in music history and shows a wide number of moods and types of composition for that instrument.

The first part of the program is made up of the Sonata in F Minor from the set of eight for that instrument and piano by George Frederick Handel followed by the Concerto in D Major, op. 27, for flute and string orchestra by Luigi Moercherini. The second part of the program opens with a short number of flute alone, Syrinx, by Claude Debussy. This will be followed by three movements selected from J. S. Bach's Suite No. 2 in B Minor.

American music will be represented on the concert by Poem written by the impressionist composer Charles T. Griffes.

The final number on the program will be Concertino by Cecile Chaminade.
