Weed Pounding Is 1,623,283

Figures just released by the County ASC Office Manager in the 1957 Annual ASC Report show that 1,623,283 pounds of burley tobacco was produced on 1496 allotment farms in 1957.
 Allotments of 785.74 acres were established by the County ASC Committee on 1586 farms. This figure included 1,083 acres allotted on five new farms on the basis of past experience.
 20.96 acres were placed in the Soil Bank Acreage Reserve and 63.40 acres were not planted. The total harvested acreage was 732.34. The average county yield was 2219 pounds per acre, the highest in the history of tobacco production for the county.
