Reformed Church To Open Assembly Ground

Blowing Rock—The Assembly Grounds of the Evangelical and Reformed Church of the Southern Synod, located near the city of Blowing Rock opened for the 14th session last week.

Several thousand members of the Evangelical and Reformed denomination will gather for various conferences, conventions, retreats and services during the next three and one-half months.

Leaders of Evangelical and Reformed Church east of the Mississippi River will gather for the Pastor's Family Conference the first week in July. Outstanding Church leaders will appear on the program during the week. Those will include—Dr. Martin Neimeier, Pastor of Evangelical Church of Germany, who spent seven years in the concentration camps during World War II; Rev. Gordon Sperry, Allenton, Pennsylvania; Dr. Robert Moss, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, the President of the Theological Seminary of the Evangelical and Reformed Church and Dr. Ernest Nolte, St. Louis, Missouri, a Professor in the Eden Theological Seminary.

In addition to the above mentioned conference the following conferences will be held: Davidson District Brotherhood Conference; Women's Guild Retreat of the Southern Synod which includes churches from North Carolina through Florida; The State Wide Christian Endeavor Conference; The Consistory Conference; The Music Conference; The Minister's Wives Conference; The Christian Educational Conference; The Churchmen's Brotherhood State Convention; The Minister's Conference and the Youth Christian Vocational Conference.

Each Sunday various congrega-

tions of the Synod will gather at the Assembly Grounds for worship, fellowship, and meditation.

At the present time the buildings at the Assembly Grounds are being re-painted and repaired and an additional building is being built.
