## Decker Invited To Safety Meet

President Eisenhower has invited Dr. Howard S. Decker, of Appalachian State Teachers College, to attend the President's Conference on Occupational Safety, to be held in Washington, D. C., March 13, 1960.

Dr. Decker is head of the department of industrial arts at ASTC. He came to Appalachian from the West Virginia Institute of Technology.

The conference will bring together in Washington more than 3,000 leaders from American industry, labor, agriculture, federal,

state and local government, insurance, education, health, and private safety organizations from all parts of the country.

Their purpose is to devise and then apply voluntary, cooperative means for reducing the 13,300 deaths and nearly 2 million disabling injuries occurring annually because of on-the-job accidents.

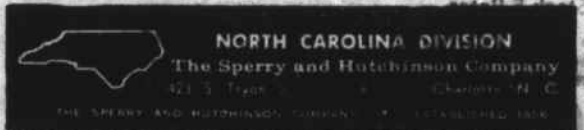
### AID ASKED
