

King's X Botanical Garden Contains Many Native Plants

The King's X Botanical Garden has developed rapidly since its beginning in the spring of 1959. Plants growing well include Maidenhair Fern, Maidenhair Spleenwort, Fringed Orchid, Crested Iris, Blue Star Grass, Wild Geranium, Mayflower, Deervine, Wild Pansy, Punctatum Rhododendron, Leucothoe, Columbine, Shooting Star and Walking Fern from Alabama, Flame Azalea, and many other wild flowers which have not yet been identified.

Among the rare items are Climbing Fern, Showy Orchid, and Shortia the "plant that was lost 100 years." Many plants at King's X are gifts from friends. Recently King's X sent a Maidenhair Spleenwort to Doan Ogden, the landscape architect in Asheville, who lacked that plant in his wild garden, and is a good friend to King's X. Mr. Ogden came to Boone a few weeks ago to talk about the Daniel Boone Wild Flower Garden. King's X is presenting the Daniel Boone Garden with a Showy Orchid which may prove to be the first wild flower planted there.

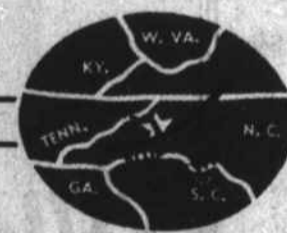
