

## 80 Resident Graduate Students Registered

Eighty resident graduate students have registered at Appalachian State Teachers College for the spring quarter, according to Dr. Cratis Williams, director of graduate studies.

Only 35 of those in residence are graduates of Appalachian. The other 45 come from 28 other colleges and universities, 18 of which are outside North Carolina.

North Carolina institutions represented include Wake Forest, Lehigh, Belmont Abbey, Elon, University of North Carolina, Woman's College of the University of North Carolina, North Carolina College, Flora Macdonald, Western Carolina and Pfeiffer.

Out-of-state institutions represented are the University of Miami, Jacksonville University, the University of Tampa, Furman University, Winthrop, Bob Jones University, Pikeville, Kentucky Wesleyan, Presbyterian, Tift, Berea, Transylvania, Murray (Ky.) State, The University of Chattanooga, Lincoln Memorial University, The University of Houston, Colorado State and Andhra University in India.

Twenty-one graduate students are from out-of-state, Florida leading the list with six. Two are from foreign countries, one from China and one from India.

Academic areas in which students are enrolled:

English 17, Social Studies 13, Physical Education 11, Mathematics 10, Biology 7, Elementary Education 7, Business Education 6, Music 3, Guidance 3, Education 2, Library Science 1.

All graduate students at Appalachian are required to complete at least a minor in education. Twenty-six now enrolled are preparing to teach in junior college.

Although 43 graduate students at Appalachian hold teaching fellowships and assistantships, Dean Williams said the number attending on fellowships and assistantships is considerably below the national average of 70 per cent.

The Holstein-Friesian Association of America has announced the completion of an outstanding official production record by a registered Holstein cow in this area—Appalachian Korndyke Inka 3379147 owned by Appalachian State Teachers' College, Boone, produced 14,940 lbs. milk and 598 lbs. butterfat in 305 days on twice daily milking as an 8-year-old.

Agricultural and Engineering supervised the weighing and testing of production as a part of the official herd testing programs of the national Holstein organization. These programs provide continuing lactation and lifetime production records on every cow in more than 2,800 participating registered Holstein herds.
