Non-bidders may purchase plans for the cost of duplication.

All contractors are hereby notified that "an act to regulate the practice of general contracting" ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and as subsequently amended public laws of 1937, ratified March 23, will be observed in receiving and awarding general contracts.

Plumbing contractors are notified that public laws of 1931, Chapter 52 as amended by public laws of 1933, Chapter 57, will be observed in receiving and awarding plumbing contracts.

Electric contractors are notified that provisions of Chapter 87, public laws of 1937, ratified March 23, will be observed in receiving and awarding electrical contracts.

Each proposal shall be accompanied by a cash deposit or a certified check drawn on some bank or trust company authorized to do business in North Carolina, of an amount equal to not less than five percent of the proposal or in lieu thereof a bidder may offer a bid bond of five percent of the proposal as required by G. Don't put it off any longer. Let's go! If you do, I am sure that our paths will cross somewhere along the line of travel because we always get in at least one trip to the

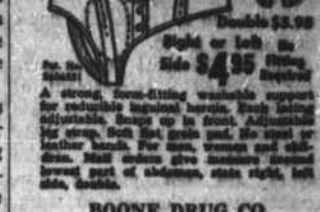
coast and on to the mountains during the summer season.
