The attendants wore white dresses of silk chiffon with green satin cummerbunds.

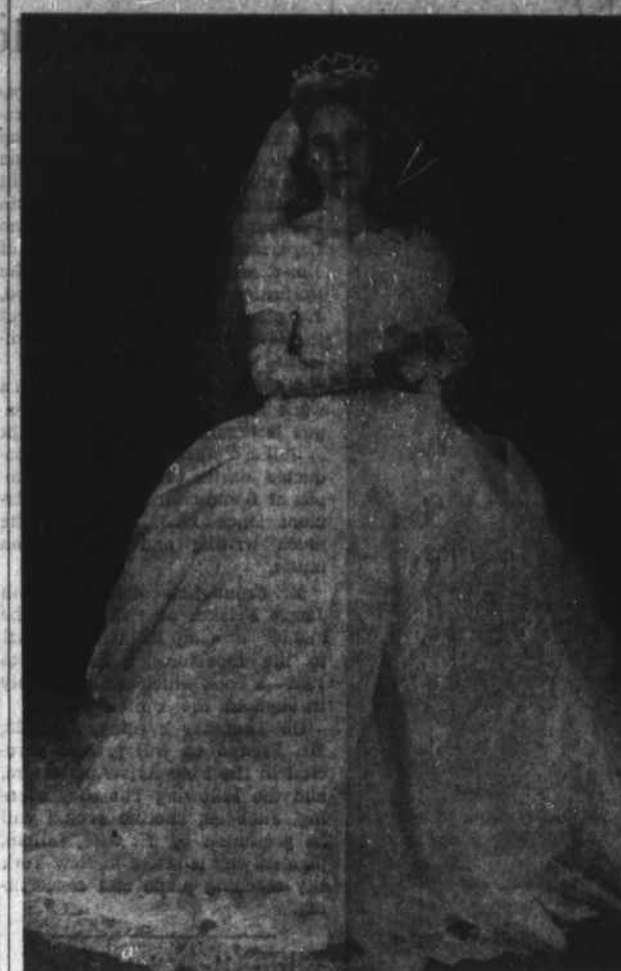
The bridegroom's father was best man.
