Brief News Items

HIJACKING BILL Airplane hijacking could bring the death penalty under a bill that awaits President Kennedy's signature. The measure has been given final congressional approval and defines the in-air seizures of planes as an act of piracy and provides penalties from twenty years in prison up to death. It also defines other crimes committed aboard an airplane in flight as Federal offenses and provides penalties.

FIRST GROUP OVERSEAS The first two Peace Corps contingents have gone overseas carrying President Kennedy's high hopes for a fresh assault on poverty and ignorance in needy nations. The President told them on the eve of their departure — bound eventually for Ghana and Tanganyika—that they carry with them the future of the Peace Corps. Kennedy has said he hopes to have 2,700 Peace Corps volunteers in the field.

SOME DOG'S LIFE Paris — A dog's life is getting more complicated all the time. Recently it was disclosed at a show of canine fashions that the dog mannequins, like human ones, have a scale of fees. The pooches, whether pedigreed or otherwise, get 50 new francs (about \$10) an hour for strutting their stuff. But if they can do so on their hind legs, the fee is boosted.

NO WATER IN HAMS One of Ezra Taft Benson's rulings has been reversed. An order by Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman prevents the addition of up to 10 percent of moisture to smoked pork products that are sold under Federal inspection. Consumer groups protested and Freeman ordered public hearings throughout the country to measure consumer reaction.

MAY LIFT DOMINICAN BAN Many Latin-American diplomats here believe the United States is seeking a way for lifting economic sanctions against the Dominican Republic. U. S. Ambassador Delesseps Morrison hopes that if the second committee report is favorable the OAS might move to lift its ban on the export of trucks, automobile parts, tires and gasoline to the Caribbean Island.

RACKETS QUIZ CONTINUES Senate rackets investigators continue to call witnesses from many states as they continue hearings on illegal handbook betting on horse races. Before the Senate investigations subcommittee ends this phase of hearings on organized crime it intends to explore publicly the tricky employer to rig betting odds and cheat bettors.

SOVIET BOMB'S DEBRIS A Government fallout expert said the cloud of radioactive debris from the first of the recent Russian nuclear tests was expected to cross the northern United States. It could not be determined when the fallout from later tests would reach this country. He explained that the amount of fallout deposited on the United States would be no greater from these tests "than it has been from any of our own test series in Nevada."

Know The Weather

By E. H. SIMS Which is the heavier, wet air or dry air. Why does the weight of the air play such a large role in the production of our weather? Wet air, it would seem, would be heavier than dry air. Wet paper, or wet cloth, is heavier than its dry counterpart, so why not heavier wet air? But the reverse is true. Wet air is lighter than dry air. If you want to understand this process thoroughly you can pick up a copy of "Eric Splan's Weather Book," which explains the weight of air with excellent diagrams and drawings. But if you are not interested in looking further than this article, here is a brief explanation. Because wet air is lighter than dry, it tends to rise and this starts the mechanism which forms clouds. Likewise, this movement produces winds, which are also produced by the sun's heat. The heaviest air is cold, dry air, and the lightest is wet, warm air. This explains why a cold front travels over the earth with its leading edge slanting backward above the earth's surface. The warm front moves in with its leading edge learning forward—and arriving overhead before its mass actually reaches you on the ground.
