"M" Night Plan New Training Union Project

R. Maines Rawls, director of associational work of the Sunday School Board's Training Union Department, reports that he expects a record number of associations in the Southern Baptist Convention to hold meetings and to have a record attendance at this year's "M" Night.
The reported attendance last year was 519,503. This completed a sixteen-year record showing an increase every year. The goal this year looks toward exceeding six hundred thousand.
The observance of "M" Night has become a mighty incentive in launching a forward emphasis in Training Union work for the new year. This year the theme is "Lengthen . . . and Strengthen." The call will be for larger Training Union enrollment and a better quality of work. Churches that do not have Training Unions will be urged to send leaders to receive encouragement to start this essential phase of work.
The program will feature "Forward in 1962." It will include inspiration and suggestions for: first, "Forward in Cooperative Activity," presenting the possibilities of promoting Training Union work in the churches thru associational meetings; second, "Forward in Reaching People," which calls for increased enrollment and the organization of new Training Unions; and third, "Forward in Attaining Our Goals," which suggests a presentation of Training Union goals by the association.
"M" Night of the Baptist Churches of the Three Forks Association will be held at the Oak Grove Baptist Church on December 11, at 7:30 p. m. The Rev. J. Boyce Brooks of Boone will be the featured speaker. The attendance goal for the association is 250.
