**Tell Of Happy Virginia Yule**  
Mr. Nathaniel Davidson and his mother, Mrs. E. Boden Davidson, arrived in Boone from Perrine, Florida, Sunday, to spend a short time at their home on Howard's Creek before continuing to Virginia. Christmas Eve and Christmas were spent in historic Abingdon. A beautiful service held at midnight in St. Thomas Episcopal Church reminded them of Christmas in English village churches. The service was entirely by candlelight. Garlands of pine, white candles, and red and white satin bows decorated the church.  
Christmas Day dinner was a traditional southern one at Martha Washington Inn complete with spoonbread and eider.  
The weather cooperated completely by blanketing the Virginia countryside in deep glistening snow. The Davidsons returned to Boone to spend a few days and to visit the Ski Lodge before proceeding to Savannah, Georgia. From Savannah, they'll return to their winter home in Perrine, Florida.

**Pensioners Are Asked To File Blanks**  
Area veterans and widows receiving non-service connected pensions from the Veterans Administration are cautioned by Lionel Ward, Watauga county veterans service officer, that the annual income questionnaires received with their December check must be completed and returned to the Veterans Administration before January 31, 1963, to avoid suspension of payment.  
Ward said that income reports are required on all income outside of pension payments, only by all persons receiving pension from the Veterans Administration. Service connected disability; death compensation, or dependency and indemnity recipients need not file annual income questionnaires.  
The questionnaires are used to determine entitlement to future payments and to make adjustments in payments where income requires it. Income limitations under the old pension law are \$1,400.00 for single persons or widows without children and \$2,700.00 for married veterans or widows with children. Under the law which began July 1, 1960, income limitations are \$1,800.00 and \$3,000.00 with graduated payments based on need and the level of income below the maximums.  
Assistance in completing the annual income questionnaires may be obtained from the county veterans service officer, who is located in Boone, or from Robert F. Currence, district officer, North Carolina Veterans Commission, 202 Frye Building, Hickory.

**SKYBOLT MISSILE**

Tentative American plans to drop the Skybolt program, and indications that President Kennedy favors this course, have caused a furor in Britain. The British were relying heavily on the 1,000-mile air to surface missile as a nuclear deterrent.

**PAY-OFF MACHINES SEIZED**  
Federal tax agents have begun raids across the nation and have seized hundreds of pay-off pinball machines.  
These moves were based on a federal court decision in Kansas last April. It upheld a IRS regulation declaring these devices without the \$250 stamp violated the law.



