## Peace Corps Quiz Set For Jan. 26

Peace Corps placement tests will be given January 26, 1963, at 8:30 A. M. at the post office in Hickory, N. C. Volunteers are especially needed for Latin American countries.

Thousands of Americans have volunteered their services to help people in need around the world through the Peace Corps. Nearly 5,000 volunteers are already at work in more than 42 countries. By the beginning of the next school year, 9,000 volunteers will be on the job.

Although a college degree is not a prerequisite for all projects, the possession of a degree is definitely considered an asset by Peace Corps officials. More than 2,000 Peace Corps liaison officers are assisting the Peace Corps on as many cam-

pages across the nation. These faculty or administration officers are the direct link between the Peace Corps and the colleges. Dr. Edward Gibson is the ASTC liaison officer.
