This was the third straight game for the Mountaineers that had ended with the final score a 2-point difference. They had previously lost to Catawba and Atlantic Christian and then finally won over the Indians by two.

The Mountaineers led the entire first half with the score being tied twice during the half. Appalachian led at the half by 28-20. In the second half Newberry caught up with the Apps and went ahead with 9:07 to play in the game on a shot by Phil Musgrave to make the score 38-36. The lead then changed hands several times until Jack Lytton put the Mountaineers in the lead to stay with a 35 foot shot with 1:58 remaining and the score standing at 51-49. The two teams then swapped a couple of free throws to make the score 52-50. Newberry then had one last chance to score but missed the final shot. Phil Musgrave had 19 points and Dave Hawk had 13 to spark the Newberry attack. For the Mountaineers Lytton was the leader with 16 points and he was followed in the scoring by Wayne Duncan with 15 and Jim Richardson with 13.

The Marion grapplers showed surprising strength in the low weights but could not cope with the equally strong Appalachian wrestlers. In the high weights the Apps were too much for Marion, taking the last six matches by pins. The last six matches took only 12:09 to be complete.

The App matmen took the first five matches by pins. These pins, added to the last six straight against Marion, add up to eleven successive pins. In all the Apps took eight pins for the second straight match. The match was costly in that two of Appalachian previously undefeated wrestlers were defeated. In 133 Johnny Cook was defeated 1-0 by Jimmy Whitmore, who was second in the state last year to Bill Cook of Appalachian. In 180 Buddy Storie was defeated 2-1 by all-state football player John Diviney of Goldsboro.

Confident after two wins against Tennessee matmen last week, the Appalachian Mountaineers are readying themselves for a double-header Saturday night with Virginia Military Institute and with St. Andrews Presbyterian College.

The meets will be staged at the local campus gymnasium. The App grapplers face VMI at 7 p. m. and St. Andrews at 8:30.

"Some of our boys might have to wrestle in both meets," Coach Dutch Meyer told the Democrat this week. A double-header wrestling card is a new venture for the Boone team, Meyer stated.

VMI, billed as one of the strongest teams the ASTC wrestlers will encounter this season, has some of the top wrestlers in the South, the Boone coach said. "It'll be a good match," Meyer predicted. "And the St. Andrews team will be hard to handle," he quickly added.

Hampered by the loss of Ed Winterstein who suffered a broken foot in a recent practice session, the App squad traveled to Carson-Newman last week and walked away with a 33-2 win.

Dean Tate, appearing in his first college match, racked up a draw decision, then won 7-3 over his Knoxville "Y" opponent. Marcus Cooke also made his college debut against C-N, winning by a forfeit.
