ASTC Professors To Conduct A Tour Of Europe During Summer

Two ASTC professors will conduct a "flying tour" of Europe this summer.

Traveling by jet plane, the group of alumni and friends of ASTC will be under the direction of Drs. John and Ina Van Noppen. The party is scheduled to leave New York on June 10 and return to New York on July 8. All travel between countries will be by air, and excursions within countries will be by private deluxe motorcoach. The air travel will enable the group to spend more time in each country visited.

Last summer the Van Noppens conducted a similar tour for teachers and students of North Carolina.

The party will stop first at Lisbon, Portugal, for sightseeing and continue to Madrid for a three-day stay. There will be an excursion to Toledo to see the old Moorish capital and the paintings of El Greco. Nice, the next stop, will serve as headquarters for seeing the Riviera and Southern France.

Dr. John Van Noppen said that in Rome they will visit the Borghese Gallery and Park, the Trevi Fountain, the Parthenon, Saint Peter's, the Coliseum, the Vatican, and the Forum. A visit will be made to Tivolo and Assisi.

Dr. Ina Van Noppen, distinguished professor of history at ASTC, said that the highlight of the tour will be the visit to Florence, the "mother of the renaissance." There they will visit the Medici and palaces, the Uffizi Gallery, the Pitti Palace, and take a look at Michelangelo's David and Dante's house.

In picturesque Venice the party will tour St. Mark's Square, the cathedral, the Doge's Palace and the Bridge of Sighs. The group will visit the palaces, the art gallery and the Hofbrau House in Munich. From Munich they will take a side trip to see Bavarian Castles and the Alps.

In romantic Paris the tour includes the Tuilleries Gardens, the Place de la Concorde, the Champs Elysee, the Arc de Triomphe, the Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, the Sorbonne, Notre Dame, the Montmartre and excursions to Versailles, the Trianon; and the Petit Trianon.

After four days in Paris they will fly to London to see Buckingham Palace, the Changing of the Guard, the Tower of London, the Curiosity Shop, the House of Parliament, Westminster Abbey. A one-day excursion will be made to the Shakespeare Country, to Oxford, Stratford-on-
