Appalachian Governors Meet At White House

Washington.—Governors representing economically hard-pressed Appalachian states were invited last week to a White House meeting Tuesday to discuss area redevelopment activities and other efforts to cope with persistent unemployment.

The White House said President Kennedy invited the Conference of Appalachian Governors to take part in a meeting with the advisory policy panel for the Area Development Administration.

The states involved are West Virginia, Virginia, Tennessee, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Maryland, Kentucky and Alabama.

The White House said it would be up to the governor's conference to determine which governors would attend.

The ARA policy group, composed of department and agency heads, would devote part of the Tuesday meeting "to special problems of the Appalachian area." That is why the governors were invited, an announcement said.

The statement added: "It is expected that there will be a summary of the activities to date, a discussion of even closer cooperation between the federal government and local governmental units concerned with the persistent unemployment of the region, and a report of the federal task force that has been

working with the Appalachian States hit hard by the floods of last month."
