Austin Adams Leads Tourney Qualifying

Austin Adams of ASTC shot a one-over par 72 and won the Carolinas Conference and NAIA District 26 golf championship with a 36-hole total of 147 Tuesday at the Boone Golf Club, to lead the team in qualifying for the NAIA tourney at Kansas City in June.

Adams, who trailed Sam Estridge of Pfeiffer by two strokes and Bobby Isenhour of Lenoir Rhyne by one after the opening round, won by six strokes over Estridge, who shot an 80 in the final round.

Defending champion and pre-tourney favorite Benjy Burnett shot an 80 for a 36-hole total of 158, and 7th place. Willie Maples of ASTC and Roy Reynolds of Catawba tied for fifth.

ASTC retained its Carolinas

Conference and NAIA District 26 team title with a 625 total, which qualified them for the NAIA championship tourney at Kansas City. The Apps team score was 28 strokes under second-place Gullford.

Ken Acker of Presbyterian, who was second in NAIA standings with a 74 first round, shot an 83 Tuesday and tied for sixth. Chappy Bradner of East Carolina finished fourth in NAIA totals and led his school to second in NAIA District 26 results.

Boone Barbell Club Takes Two State Championships

Johnny Roten and Don Cooper, members of the Mountain View Barbell Club of Boone, lifted their way to state champions in the annual "Mr. Tarheel and Most Muscular Man in North Carolina" contest Saturday. The state-wide contest was held in Winston-Salem at the YMCA.

Phil Minor, in the 123 pound division, and Bill Broyhill, in the 148 pound division, both of the local club, won second-place honors in the meet. Kenny Moore, of the same club, also lifted.

Roten, a junior at Appalachian High School, won the first place position in the 165 pound class by pressing 230 pounds, snatching 220 pounds, and clean

and jerking 300 pounds, for a final total of 750 pounds.

Cooper, a freshman at Appalachian State Teachers College, took the 181 honors with a final total of 780 pounds.

Minor is a sophomore at Appalachian High School and is the smallest boy in the local club. Broyhill is from Lenoir and has been lifting with the club since its beginning in 1960. He lifted the same total as the first-place winner, but placed second because he weighed slightly more than the winner.

Although no trophy was offered to the team for points, the Mountain View club had the highest total, 16 points, of any group participating.

Avery Airport Is Given Funds

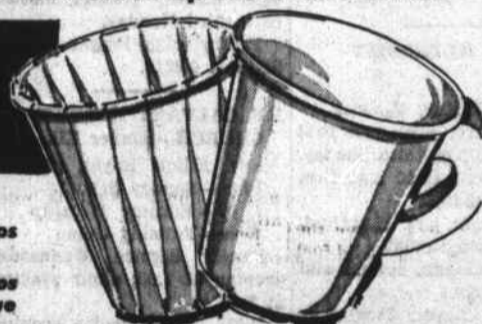
