Dr. Spence Starts 16th Summer As Pastor Blowing Rock Church

The Blowing Rock Methodist Church opened its sixteenth summer session last Sunday, June 9.

As the majority of our readers know, this church was once on a four point circuit, being connected with what is now the Boone Circuit. In the course of time its members died or moved away and the church was abandoned for many years. Sixteen years ago some of the local Methodists decided to under-

take to reopen the church for the summer cottagers and tourists. Dr. H. E. Spence of Duke University was secured as pastor during the summer season only. He has preached for fifteen consecutive summers here.

Dr. Spence thought that he would not return to Blowing Rock this season. Last year he rounded out fifteen years as pastor here, sixty years as a Methodist minister and eighty

years of life. This looked like the appropriate place to give up the work. He was so sure that he would not return he discontinued his telephone and carried all of his belongings back to Durham with him.

Upon the insistence of his members and of the Bishop of this area, Dr. Spence reconsidered his decision and has returned for this season. The opening services were well attended Sunday and the prospects for the summer seem bright. Services will be held each Sunday morning at eleven o'clock. They are always arranged for congregational cooperation and have the added attraction of being short. The services never last more than an hour.

Persons from a dozen different sections of the state were there Sunday and it is expected that a large number of tourists will find this "church away from home" attractive.

The subject for next Sunday will be "God and Family Life". It will be especially appropriate for Father's Day.

The chairman of the official board this summer is Mr. Tom Dysard, Jr. of Statesville.

Dr. Spence will continue his work with the Blowing Rock Hospital as he has done for these twelve or fifteen years. He has moved to one of the Hart Cottages near the hospital. His telephone number is 295-7583. He will gladly render any services he possibly can while pastor here.

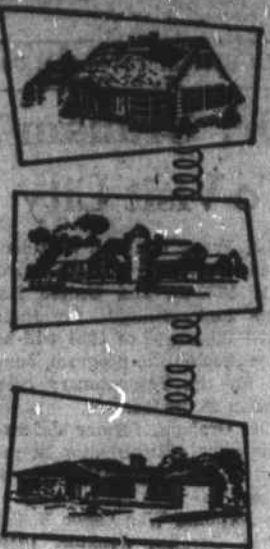
