Local People To Attend Lebanon Meeting

Word has just been received that Marshall Hargrave, Educational Director of First Baptist Church, Boone, and "Hank" Greer, Baptist Campus Chaplain at Appalachian State Teachers College, have been designated as Discussion Group Leaders at the 6th Baptist Youth World Conference in Beirut, Lebanon, July 15-21. Hargrave and Greer will be conducting a tour of Europe and the Near East, in conjunction with this international gathering of Baptist youth. An attendance of 4000 young people and youth leaders from as many as 70 countries is expected to assemble in the U.N.E.S.C.O. Auditorium for their major sessions. Morning lectures will be held in five different locations, followed by many small discussion groups to allow the youth to discuss the meaning of the day's topic in their own countries and particular cultures. Both tour conductors have been asked to lead one of these discussion groups.
