# Red Cross News

The man who began what might be called the humanitarian revolution, one hundred years ago, his name is Henri Dunant, a 31 year old Swiss businessman. (His idea was truly revolutionary) and is still being recognized the world over today in many ways. The experiences he had on the battlefield of Solferino, Italy, created a new spirit to the suffering of humanity all over the world today.  
The question that came into his mind there on that battlefield was: "Would it be possible in time of peace and quiet, to form relief societies for the purpose of giving care to the sick and wounded by devout qualified volunteers?"  
His answer was: "The only possible way to turn is to the public. For it is through the cooperation of the people that we can expect to attain the desired goal."  
Therefore, we appeal to all men of all classes, for all can do something to help the good work forward.  
We of the Watauga County Chapter of the American Red Cross are very grateful to the volunteers of the Red Cross Blood Program, who so eagerly give their services and their blood to save the lives of the ones who we hold so dear to us in this county. They are particularly an inspiration to the ideals of Mr. Dunant in the improvements of caring for our sick and wounded in our hospitals.  
Blood unlike money—cannot be stored away for a long period of time. Therefore this makes it possible for us to have

frequent collections of blood in order to take care of the sick and wounded in our hospitals round about us.  
Our next visit of our bloodmobile unit will be July 9, at East Hall on the ASTC campus. We make an appeal to the people of Watauga county to render their services to humanity, by donating a pint of blood, in order to save the lives of someone who might be near or dear to our heart.  
Let us also remember that a pint of blood is only a "mite," compared to the things Red Cross is doing for humanity the world over.  
"The sun never sets" on the work of the A. R. C. the world over—each hour of the day and night around the world, field directors, representatives and delegates are carrying out the principles of Red Cross work to our service men and families, disaster victims, and various other examples of services to humanity.  
Let us remember that the pint of blood we give to the bloodmobile unit may save our own life or the life of a loved one. So let us give as often as we can, so that we may have a part in this "humanitarian revolution."
