BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,830,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WATAUGA

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education of the County of Watauga has determined that existing school plant facilities in the Watauga County School Administrative Unit are not adequate for the maintenance of public schools for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to provide the sum of \$1,830,000 to finance additional school plant facilities such as are described in Section 1 of this bond order and which said County Board of Education has determined are necessary to enable the County of Watauga, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in said Watauga County School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Watauga as follows: Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Watauga has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to erect in the Watauga County School Administrative Unit several new buildings, school garages, physical education and vocational education buildings, teacherages and lunchrooms and other school plant facilities and to reconstruct and to enlarge, by the erection of additions, several existing buildings located in such units and used for such purposes, and to acquire land, furnishings and equipment necessary for such new or reconstructed or enlarged buildings, in order to enable the County of Watauga, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in said School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term as prescribed by law.

Section 2. In order to provide funds for such purpose, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, bonds of the County of Watauga are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds authorized by this bond order shall be One Million Six Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,630,000).

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County debt of the County of Watauga has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said act.

The foregoing bond order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$33,000,000 and the net debt for school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$15,400. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting place of said Board of the County Court House, in Boone, North Carolina, at 10 o'clock a. m. on the 5th day of August, 1963, or an adjournment thereof.
