Blue Ridge Garden Club

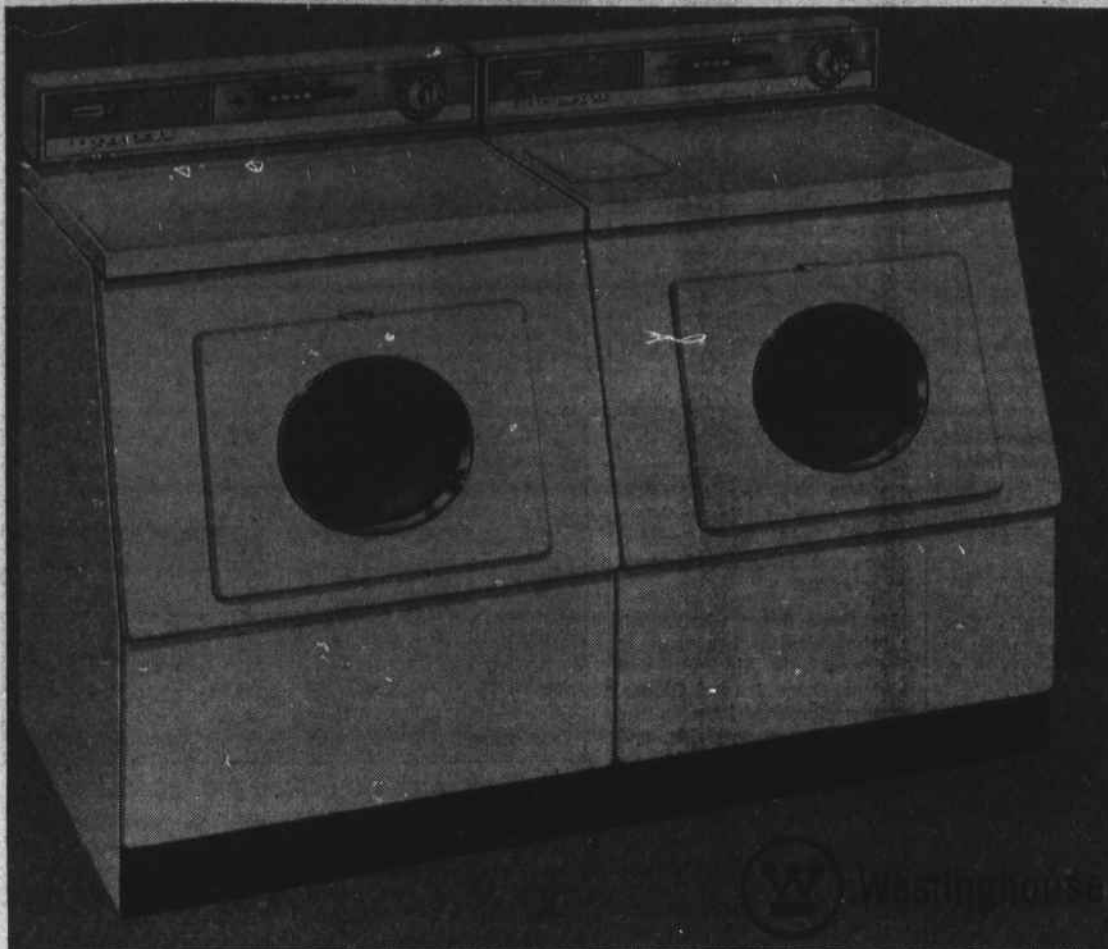
