Require plant, Dutchman's Breeches, safe storage and use of pestiwith an outbreak of "blind staggers" among livestock in southwest Virginia. This was a good number of years ago.

Having aroused my curlosity, I consulted Dr. Hardin's bulletin, "Poisonous Plants of North Carolina," and confirmed my suspicion. I also checked with a member of the staff in Veterinary Science.

Dutchman's Breeches con tains several alkaloids which poison cattle when eaten. This plant is found in the deep woods and cliffs in most of our mountain counties and, locally, in a small area of the Pied-

It does make a good garden plant, however, if placed in a shaded spot between rocks and in good soil. The name comes from the small divided blossoms which resemble a pair of miniature Dutchman's breeches. The plant flowers from April study. through May producing four to




