Doctor Talk

An "altered reactivity" is the definition for an allergy, thus the allergic state of the body or any previously sensitized portion of it reacts violently when brought into contact with the specific substance of substances — this substance causing no reaction in unsensitized individuals. The term "hay fever" commonly brings to mind the typical patient posture that is sneezing on the slightest provocation, a watery nasal discharge, nasal obstruction, itching about the eyes, nose and in roof of the mouth. Instead of the term "hay fever," it is more correct to refer to the condition as allergic rhinitis, as it commonly occurs from the pollen of trees, grasses, weeds and occasionally flowers.
Other factors can produce attacks of allergic rhinitis or "hay fever," such as house dust, feathers, animal danders and molds — and many individuals will have multiple sensitivities, as in allergies to pollens and animal danders, etc.
All patients with the typical symptoms of hay fever, as described above, can, after skin testing, be found to have no demonstrable sensitivities to extrinsic substances. In these people the nasal symptoms are apt to be aggravated by temperature and barometric changes, fatigue, emotional upsets or strong odors. term of vasomotor rhinitis is applied to this group of individuals the applied.
Treatment to relieve the symptoms of allergy, whether seasonal (occurring at the same time each year) or perennial, should

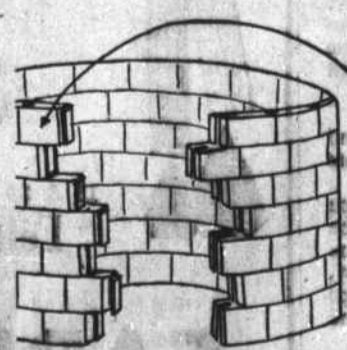
be undertaken in every case of allergic rhinitis — the specific type of treatment being determined by your doctor. With the institution of treatment, such as the use of antihistamine drugs or the use of hyposensitizing injections following skin testing, the hypersensitivity to the causative factor will be reduced and possibly eliminated completely.

MORE FOR PEACE CORPS
President Kennedy has asked Congress to appropriate \$108,000,000 for an expanded Peace Corps.
The money would provide funds to enable the corps to place some 13,000 volunteers in training or abroad by September, 1964. This will be a 4,000 increase over the number expected to be enrolled by the end of this year.
