

Washington Report

The feverish activity last Wednesday at both ends of the gracious mall that sweeps from the Capitol to the Potomac will be long remembered. At the Lincoln Memorial more than 200,000 persons gathered for a massive demonstration to demand civil rights legislation and a number of social welfare measures they believe would improve the lot of the negro race in this country. The demonstration in many ways was without precedent. On Capitol Hill, the House was busily engaged in debating precedent-making emergency legislation to avoid a nationwide railroad strike due to start a few hours later.

If the House had failed to act, the country would have suffered a crisis that could have been catastrophic. There is no doubt that within a short time, every American would have been personally affected, our economy thrown into a fantastic tailspin, and the nation's defense effort severely throttled. It was because of the real prospect of a strike nobody wanted that caused Congress to enact legislation distasteful to even its strongest supporters.

As the crisis developed in the last six weeks, there were comments in the press that the Con-

gress resented being thrown a hot potato by the President. Such remarks simply failed to understand the seriousness of the problem and the caution Congressional action required.

The dispute between the railroads and the railroad employee brotherhoods had gone on for more than four years. Both the Eisenhower and Kennedy Administrations had made available all the machinery of the Federal government to assist in its settlement. Fact-finding commissions had been appointed and made recommendations they thought might point a way toward a settlement. Legal questions had run the gamut of the Federal Courts. Still, the dispute continued. It was then that the White House recommended emergency action to the Congress.

Free collective bargaining by management and labor is one of the foundations of the free enterprise system. It is a freedom upon which our entire economic structure rests. We know that if the Federal government injects itself into labor-management arguments with requirements of compulsory arbitration, we will have chipped away part of our economic cornerstone. We will have destroyed it entirely when the process leads on to Federal control of wages and prices. Free labor and free management will then have been a thing of the past with both dependent upon

Federal arbitrators for the solution of their problems. Congress reluctantly took the minimum action required by the situation, balancing the chaos of a strike against the evils of compulsory arbitration. It was a carefully calculated middle course. It may prove inadequate if so-

lutions are not reached when the time limit runs out next February. It is, however, a serious challenge to both sides in the dispute to come to agreement or create a new crisis for our economic system. Every American has a stake in what they do or fail to do.

Legal Notice

BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,630,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WATAUGA.

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education of the County of Watauga has determined that existing school plant facilities in the Watauga County School Administrative Unit are not adequate for the maintenance of public schools for the nine months' school term prescribed by law, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to provide the sum of \$1,630,000 to finance additional school plant facilities such as are described in Section 1 of this bond order and which said County Board of Education has determined are necessary to enable the County of Watauga, as an administrative agency of the public schools in said Watauga County School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term prescribed by law; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Watauga as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Watauga has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to erect in the Watauga County School Administrative Unit several new buildings to be used as school houses, school garages, physical education and vocational education buildings, teacherages and lunchrooms and other school plant facilities and to reconstruct and to enlarge, by the erection of additions, several existing buildings located in such unit and used for such purposes, and to acquire land, furnishings and equipment necessary for such new or reconstructed or enlarged buildings, in order to enable the County of Watauga, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, to maintain public schools in said School Administrative Unit for the nine months' school term as prescribed by law.

Section 2. In order to provide funds for such purpose in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, bonds of the County of Watauga are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds authorized by this bond order shall be One Million Six Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,630,000).

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County debt of the County of Watauga has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under The County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$33,000,000 and the net debt for school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$1,645,400. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting place of said Board in the County Court House, in Boone, North Carolina, at 10 o'clock, a. m., on the 18th day of September, 1963, or an adjournment thereof.
