Make sauce of cherry juice, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 1/2 teaspoon flour and 1 tablespoon butter. Boil few minutes and pour over pudding while hot. This is very good served with vanilla ice cream.

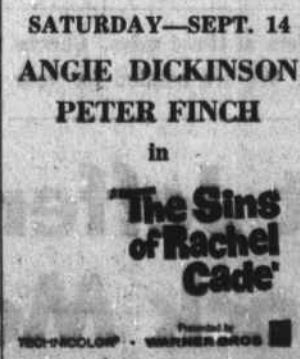
