## Smith To Speak At Mission Rally

Rev. Edward F. Smith, missionary to the Congo, Africa, now on leave from the Board of Missions, will speak to the North Wilkesboro District Our Mission Today Rally at Boone Methodist Church, 7:30 p. m., October 6.

Smith, a graduate of Duke Divinity School whose home is Raleigh, is now serving as pastor of the Methodist Church in Hillsboro.

While in the Congo, Rev. Mr. Smith taught in secondary schools and served on the faculty of the first Protestant seminary in the Congo. He taught at the Faculty of Protestant Theology in Elizabethville which is sponsored by six denominations including the Methodist Church. The seminary gives training to Africans on the university level, the first protestant school to offer advanced education.

The Rally will be under the leadership of Rev. Herman Duncan, District Superintendent; Rev. James McNeely, District Missionary Secretary; and Dr. Horace R. McSwain, Executive Secretary of the Conference Board of Missions, Statesville. Rev. Richard J. Crowder will be the host minister.

## Counselor To Visit Students

Mrs. Jones is a widow with two teen-age sons, and a daughter in college. When her husband died quite suddenly, she found it necessary to go to work to support her family and insure the future education of her children.

Mrs. Jones needs a sympathetic ear, and this will be supplied when Dr. and Mrs. David Mace arrive in Watauga County on October 21-23. Though Mrs. Jones is fictitious, her problem is not, and she needs the advice of a trained counselor to help her.

Dr. Mace is currently executive director of the American Association of Marriage Counselors, and is widely read and heard as a foremost authority in the field of family relations.

While in our county all high school students will be given the opportunity to hear him, and special addresses to parents and interested adults will be arranged. The entire Family Life Conference is sponsored by a special committee of which the Rev. Boyce Brooks, minister of the First Baptist Church of Boone, is chairman.
