# Apps Down Wasps In Saturday Tilt By Skimpy 21-19 Margin

Appalachian rolled up a three-touchdown lead over the Wasps of Emory & Henry last Saturday afternoon, but had to fight off a last-minute Emory drive to preserve a 21-19 victory. The win was the sixth in nine games for the Mountaineers and the second loss in 15 games for Emory & Henry.

Appalachian started the scoring parade the first time they had the ball. Quarterback Dennis Saunders, starting his first game

since October 12, threw a perfect 31-yard pass to end Terry Harbin. Saunders added the first after with 10:32 left in the first quarter. Appalachian threatened the next time the Mountaineers had ball possession, but a field goal attempt by Joe Hightower failed.

With time running out in the first quarter, fullback Larry Lawing crashed over from the two for the second Appalachian tally. A short Emory punt and a fine rushback moved the ball to the Wasps' 34. A penalty moved the ball to the 19, and Lawing

carried three times for the remaining 19 yards. Saunders threw to Hightower for a two-point conversion, moving the halftime score to 15-0.

Each team had scoring opportunities during the third stanza, but neither could do it. Instead, until Saunders found fullback Steve Norville in the Wasps' end zone with 16 seconds to play in the quarter. Saunders hit Norville with a 14-yard scoring pass, climaxing a 75-yard march. Jimmy Hayes was the big ground gainer in the drive, running 57 yards on one play to the Emory & Henry 14. A two-point attempt failed, and Appalachian had its last score for the day.

Emory & Henry came back strong after having been contained for all but three seconds of three quarters. Fullback Earl Hawkins took Appalachian's kickoff and ran it 96 yards for a touchdown. The try for extra points failed. Seconds later the Wasps had another scoring opportunity when Norville fumbled the ensuing kickoff on the App. 36. Six plays later quarterback Carey Anderson ran over from the one for a score. The extra points attempt again failed.

After holding the Mountaineers for downs, the fired-up Wasps drove 53 yards for their final score, climaxing by Anderson's 41-yard run. A pass for extra points failed when Van Orden intercepted and the final 21-18 score was posted.

Emory & Henry had another scoring opportunity after recovering a Mountaineer fumble on the Appalachian 21. However, the Appalachian line rose to the occasion, and the game ended with the Mountaineers in possession of the ball.
