Rev. Mr. Lawson Will Preach At Holy Cross

The Reverend John Lawson, retired English Methodist minister, now professor of Church History and Doctrine at Candler School of Theology, Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia, will be guest preacher Sunday, December 1, at the Episcopal Church of the Holy Cross, Valle Crucis, at 11 a. m., it was announced by Ronald Gibson, who is in charge of the Church of the Holy Cross.
Dr. Lawson, who spent his ministry serving small rural English Methodist Chapels in England, now spends the school term months teaching here in America. He is acclaimed as a scholar in church history and Biblical historical doctrine. He has also written several books.
Dr. Lawson is a man with extensive experience and faith. Mr. Gibson said in his announcement. In his career, he has continued his work and study through many trials and errors. Like so many persecuted Christians before him, one of his best works was written to the sound and roar of German V2 rockets winging their way towards destruction and death in his own home land. In the preface of his book "The Biblical Theology of Saint Irenaeus" (Epworth Press, 1948, London), he writes: "As one composed earlier chapters 'the terror that flieth by night' could be heard moaning his way inland, solitary and in long succession, throughout the protracted hours of darkness. One grieved for one's fellow-citizens. As one proceeded with later revisions one could see multiplied and frightful retribution going out, at first by summer twilight, at length in broad day."
Under such conditions as these, Dr. Lawson has learned the Gospel message of hope in a way few of us will have the opportunity. Dr. Lawson, as he heard fear and death fly overhead, each time to visit someone else, realized as did Paul when cellmates were carried to the lions and he was spared, that each of us have a life bought with a price.
The awareness of the price paid for our lives rings through Dr. Lawson's work and service for the Lord. Anyone wishing to experience the realization of the price paid for each of us by Christ, should want to hear Dr. Lawson, Mr. Gibson said.
The Church of the Holy Cross is located on N. C. 194, midway between Boone and Banner Elk.

ARGENTINE AID

Congressional leaders have called for immediate suspension of American aid as a result of Argentina's cancellation of agreements with U. S. oil companies.

Health and Beauty

Mental health is being recognized today as a problem we can do something about. Almost any modern magazine you choose to read will carry several articles concerning this subject during a year's time. Information on this subject is available to all of us.
Not only this, but it is a subject freely discussed by people from all walks of life. It is no longer a subject covered with mystery and shame. We know that a weakness for certain forms of mental illness does run in some families, but more important than this we have learned that these weaknesses can be overcome by the kind of life a person leads.
One of the most important lessons a parent can teach a child is self-control. Without self-control, life will be a burden to the individual involved and to all the people who must come into daily contact with the individual. Lack of self-control, carried to the extreme, is nothing more than a form of mental illness.
Parents have a great responsibility raising children. Today, we recognize that this responsibility does not end with food, shelter, clothes and such material things. It includes helping your child adjust to the problems of life.
A very young child's problems are usually all if they receive enough love and affection from their family. Often a problem will arise when a new brother or sister comes into a family where there was formerly only one child. Except in extreme cases, this can be handled by lavishing attention to the older child until he comes to love his younger brother or sister and adjust to the new situation.
As a child gets older, he must be guided into unselfish habits. He must learn to play on a team and not feel that unless he is captain, he won't play. Help your child adjust to his shortcomings.
A child's play can be a good indication of his smartness, ac-

ording to a new theory. Bright babies' play shows more ingenuity. During their second year precocious tots use a great deal of imagination. Backward children seldom vary their play. As they grow older the bright children seem to care less about competitive games and go in for

card and guessing games. However your child seems to be developing, never push him unless you want a nervous, insecure child and adult.
