

## Applicants Slow To Register For Second Liquor Ration Book

### Registration Ends Nov. 30; Not Reopened Until First of Year

If the same number of liquor ration books are to be issued in Chowan County in the second registration as were issued in the first registration, applicants will have to apply at a more rapid rate or else a tremendous rush will be experienced during the latter days of the registration which will end November 30, and after which no ration books will be issued until January 1.

For this reason members of the Chowan County ABC Board urge all who desire to secure the second ration book to apply as early as possible and not wait until the very last minute. Applicants, in order to secure the second ration book, which will be good to purchase liquor from December 1, 1943, to November 30, 1944, must present their War Ration Book No. 3, which will be punched.

## Welfare Report

Ninety-six people in Chowan County received old age assistance during the month of October, the amount distributed being \$1,139. There were also 14 cases of aid to dependent children, representing 31 children and the distribution of \$354. Six blind cases received \$75.

According to the report of Mrs. J. H. McMullan, superintendent of public welfare, \$82.94 was distributed among six general relief cases; five adult and six juvenile prison parolees were under supervision; seven employment certificates were issued to minors; seven investigations were made concerning dependency for the War Department; two patients were referred to a hospital for charity rates; one was referred to a hospital at county expense; free admissions were secured for three for orthopedic surgery at Duke; three persons were given free clothing and one investigation was made for adoption proceedings.
