That persistent lagging of Chowan County in practically every phase of the salvage program has attracted the attention of State salvage officials was reflected in the fact that on Thursday of last week three prominent officials were in Edenton in order to discover the trouble and put Chowan County on the active

The three officials who came in the interest of the salvage campaign were James B. Vogler, executive secretary of the North Carolina Salvage Committee; W. S. McCall, district salvage chairman, and Lucius C. Wilson, field salvage representative. The trio held a conference with J. Edwin Bufflap, chairman of the Chowan County Salvage Committee, and Mayor Leroy Haskett in an effort to begin a program which will bring in waste materials necessary in war production.

Both McCall and Wilson were back in Edenton again Tuesday and assured Haskett and Bufflap that a large quantity of scrap iron which has accumulated in Edenton will definitely be moved at once, which should be an incentive rather than an excuse not to gather scrap metal throughout the county.
