Your local Tax Lister is required to make the records but Farm Owners or Tenants must furnish the facts. Therefore, call your list taker's attention to these records and be prepared to furnish the following information: (1) Acreage for each crop harvested during calendar year 1942 (2) Number of horses, mules, cows, sows, ewes and hens on farm January, 1944. (3) Number of people living on farm January, 1944. (4) Number of threshing machines, combines, peanut pickers, farm tractors and farm trucks. All of the above information furnished will be considered as confidential and will not be used in any manner that is detrimental to the farmers concerned. It is not used for tax purposes.

Do your part to insure complete farm reports for your County and remind your neighbors to give their farm record to the local Tax Lister.
