The purpose of the G. I. Bill is clear in that it was meant to assist veterans who are attempting to set themselves up in business. The law specifies that an individual must be fully engaged in an independent operation for profit, and in addition, must be doing those things which are reasonably calculated to promote the success of his undertaking. 




