Final Stage Reached In Leasing Air Station

Awaiting Only Approval By Navy of Town's Sub Lease

Mayor Leroy Haskett has been informed that the Navy Department has approved the latest inventory at the Edenton Naval Air Station as presented, with the exception of three items, including sewing machines, safes and a few Hollywood beds in officers' quarters. These items, however, will not interfere with the operation of the Hervey Foundation, so that it will be a matter of a very short time before the Navy Department will execute a permanent revocable lease to take the place of the temporary lease recently signed.

Likewise, the Hervey Foundation will very shortly sign the lease prepared by the Town of Edenton, so that the organization will before very long begin preliminary plans for operation in building pre-fabricated houses and a program of biological research having to do with mass breeding of high class cattle.

About \$20,000 worth of equipment is now on a railroad siding in Ohio ready to be shipped upon information that the Navy Department has approved the sub-lease executed by the Town of Edenton to the Hervey Foundation. A letter containing the lease was sent to the Navy Department Monday by Mayor Haskett, and it is confidently expected it will be approved. David Hervey, president of the Foundation, is awaiting a reply from Mayor Haskett, at which time he will order equipment shipped to Edenton.

County Agent C. W. Overman reports that according to information received, the recent rat campaign in the county has been very satisfactory. In order to secure more definite results, Mr. Overman has mailed questionnaires to every person who received bait during the drive and when these are returned a better idea of the effectiveness of the drive will be available.

R. K. Hollowell of the Cross Roads community reported picking up 21 dead rats the morning after the bait was put out, while Hawkins Elliott of the Ryland section reported finding at least 100 or more dead rats. He also estimated that at least another 100 were killed under his barn.
