a. Prior authority by the Veterans Administration to hospitalize the patient. When the case is highly emergent, and it is impractical to obtain prior approval, the veteran may be hospitalized and the Chief Medical Officer of the Veterans Administration Regional Office subsequently notified. This notification must reach the VA Regional Office within 72 hours from the time of such hospitalization. Strict compliance with this requirement is essential to settlement of the account.
