

Attendance At PTA Breaks All Records

Group Now Interested In Several Important Projects

Approximately 100 members and visitors attended the Edenton Parent-Teachers Association meeting last week in the High School Library, which was the largest attendance in the history of the organization. Mrs. J. Clarence Leary, president, made an inspiring address to the newly appointed grade mothers, who are busy on the attendance record and who were responsible for such a goodly representation of parents at the meeting.

Mrs. Paul Wallace, lunch room chairman, reported that a total of 6,820 lunches were served in the lunch room during the month of October.

Mrs. Rupert Goodwin, finance chairman, urged the group to keep the forthcoming bazaar in mind and asked that each parent present help to advertise the affair, which will be held December 7 and 8. Mrs. Goodwin also announced that the PTA

Finance Committee will sponsor a dancing class if enough pupils can be obtained. A class of not less than 30 members is necessary, since a teacher from Norfolk will not consider a smaller class. All interested parents are, therefore, asked to contact Mrs. Goodwin as early as possible.

The Girl Scout Committee, headed by Mrs. A. B. Harless as chairman and Miss Louise Morgan as leader, expect to start a renewed program as soon as the organization is completed and a meeting place can be obtained.

The organization discussed the vacancy on the Edenton School Board of Trustees caused by the recent death of W. D. Pruden, and during the discussion Mrs. James E. Wood was mentioned as a capable successor to Mr. Pruden.

A proposed nursery school was discussed in view of the fact that many parents could attend PTA meetings if they would have a safe place to leave their children during the meeting. Miss Josephine Grant, home economics teacher, suggested that girls from her advanced groups would be available for one hour each meeting day of the organization, and that they would cooperate in making the proposed nursery school a success.

John A. Holmes reported that the school trustees had discussed a new school building program for both white and colored and that a committee is studying present crowded conditions in the schools.

The next meeting will be held Tuesday afternoon, December 9, when all parents and interested citizens are urged to attend.

Col. Long attended North Carolina State College. He arrived at Keesler Field Air Training Command Station in May, 1946, and remained here until the time of his discharge, assigned to duty as finance officer. He was also stationed at Fort Bragg, N. C., Fort Jackson, S. C., and Camp Polk, La.

During overseas service for 15 months he was awarded the European Theater Ribbon, American Theater Ribbon, American Defense Medal and the WW II Victory Medal.
