The quail season is November 27 through January 31. In Hyde, Martin, Tyrrell and Washington counties quail hunting is allowed on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays only. In other counties, hunting is allowed Mondays through Saturdays. Daily bag limit 8, possession limit 16, season limit 150.

Rabbit season is from November 27 through January 31. In Hyde, Martin, Tyrrell and Washington counties rabbit hunting is allowed Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays only. In other counties, Mondays through Saturdays. The daily bag limit is 8, possession limit 16 and no season limit.
