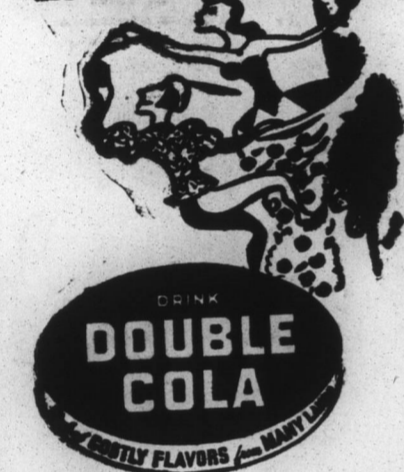
GLIDEN NEWS
