### Efforts Made to Correct All Legitimate Complaints

Representatives of the Senior and Junior Chamber of Commerce made a visit to the local phone company this past week and were cordially received by Mrs. Luther Keeter, chief operator. Two new boards have been added to take care of the increased phone traffic. Mrs. Keeter pointed out by demonstration that a rapid jiggling of the receiver by an impatient client did not register on the board but that a slow motion caused a light to go on and also to make a signal in the receiver worn by the operator. It was also clearly demonstrated that on long distance calls, as soon as the call was completed a red light flashed on before the operator, who immediately stamped a ticket with a time clock to record the termination of the call.

Mrs. Keeter expressed a wish that many others would pay a visit to the company and learn first hand how the phone traffic is handled. She stated that every effort will be made to correct any legitimate complaint, and that the operators and the company feel encouraged over the interest shown in their problems.
